Located on 200 acres in the City of Peterborough, Sutherland Campus is the largest campus with about 6,000 full-time students and 70 full-time programs.



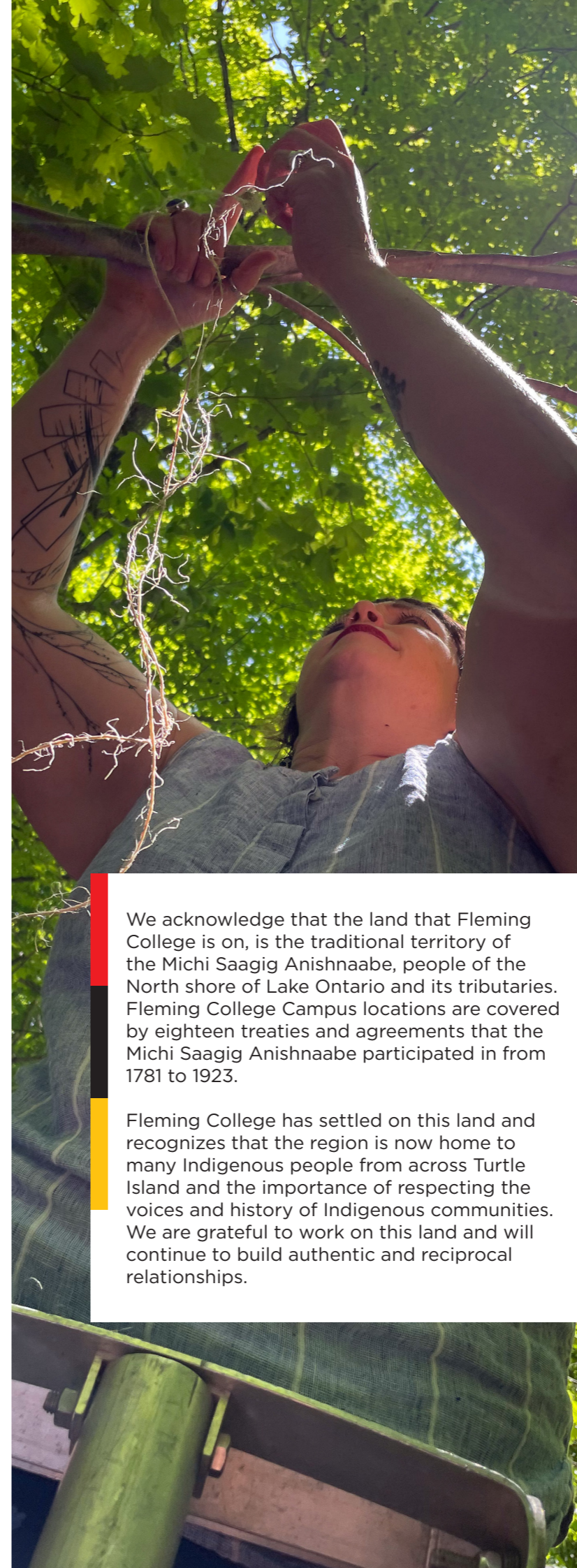
Frost Campus

Homestay

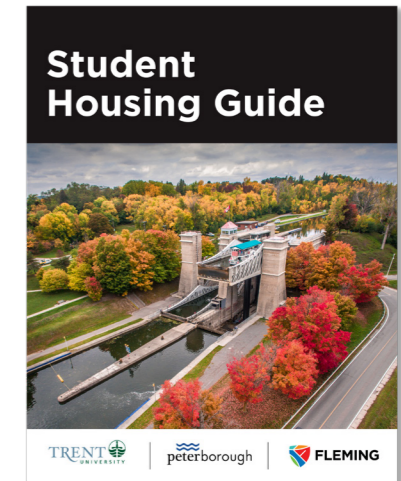

Our on-campus RISIAs hold regular information sessions and can advise on study permits, Canadian immigration programs and temporary resident visas.

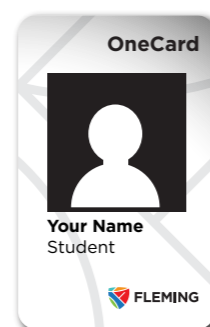

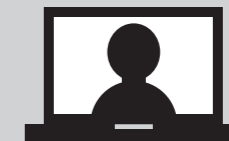

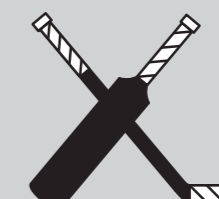

Electrical Techniques

Develop basic skills in electricity, network cabling and electrical system installation as a pathway to a variety of occupations or the Electrical Engineering Technician program.

Heavy Equipment Techniques (Co-op)

Maintain and repair heavy equipment vehicles and machinery using onsite state-of-the-art equipment. Includes a paid co-op. High employment rates.

Mechanical Techniques – Plumbing

Learn basic skills for work installing, maintaining and repairing piping systems. Graduates qualify for exemption from Level One basic in-class portion of the plumbing apprenticeship and can obtain industry-recognized certifications, including the Operation of Small Drinking Water Systems course.

Trade Fundamentals

This program provides a sampler of basic level construction and trades skills and a pathway with transfer credits to several Fleming College trades programs.

Welding Techniques

Enter the welding trade's vast employment and specialization opportunities or continue to the second year of the Welding and Fabrication Technician diploma program. Graduates can challenge two welding certifications (SMAW 1GF and 2GF) from the Canadian Welding Bureau.

DIPLOMAS

Carpentry and Renovation Technician

Graduate with the requirements for general carpenter apprentice level two and a career in the renovation and construction field. You will gain business and home renovation skills that include entrepreneurial skills, custom millwork, basic plumbing, wiring and drywalling.

Electrical Engineering Technician

Electrical and electronic theory and practice will train you for an entry position or apprenticeship in the electrical industry.

Generator Service Technician (Co-op)

Obtain specialized skills to install, maintain and test electrical power generation units for emergency power, standby power and prime power generation. Plus, learn to maintain, service and install diesel, gasoline and natural gas powered generators. Includes a paid co-op.

Heating, Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Technician

This hands-on program emphasizes renewable, sustainable and alternative energy efficient practices. Qualified students can apply to write certificates of qualification for Oil Burner Technician (OBT-3, OBT-2) and Gas Technician (G-3, G-2).

Motive Power Technician – Recreational and Sport Vehicles (Optional Co-op) ^{FC}

This is the only diploma program in Ontario to offer interdisciplinary training for aviation, marine, recreational vehicles, and small engine maintenance and repair. An optional co-op and in-school apprenticeship training ensures you will graduate with a head start on your career.

Welding and Fabrication Technician

Gain hands-on experience in all major welding processes and metal cutting techniques for entry-level positions. Qualified students can challenge several welding certificates from the Canadian Welding Bureau.

ADVANCED DIPLOMAS

Electrical Engineering Technology (Optional Co-op)

This advanced diploma focuses on industrial electrical power, process control, and automation systems. You will receive extensive hands-on training on the latest equipment and software gaining valuable technical knowledge and experience. An optional co-op is available.

GRADUATE CERTIFICATE

Mechatronics ^{FC}

The only post-graduate program of its kind in Ontario, this unique interdisciplinary engineering program focuses on advanced manufacturing, industrial automation, electronics engineering and computer programming. Includes leading-edge lab courses and a real-world applied project.




All of our programs offer placements or work experiences you can add to your résumé when you graduate.

Simulation-based learning

Our high tech Simulation Centre creates immersive learning experiences. The technology and facilities in this centre include:

- Fully equipped, nursing and PSW labs.
- High fidelity mannequins that can be programmed to simulate a large number of conditions. Students can perform a variety of procedures, which will produce real time responses to interventions.
- A Home lab to practice skills in a home environment.
- A high tech SIM lab, where simulations can be projected onto 3 walls and the floor, and walls can turn into touch screens for videos.
- A security hub, suspect/asset interview rooms, jail cell and prop car.

Personal Support Worker

Approximately 400 hours of relevant theory and 300 hours of real-life, clinical training will prepare you for a satisfying, people-focused career, helping to maximize the life experience of children, adults and seniors with special needs or disabilities.

DIPLOMAS

Esthetician – Spa Management

Graduate in just 12 months with the equivalent of two years of study. More than 280 hours of practical experience at our state-of-the-art Spa + Clinic will give you the technical skills to provide a full range of treatments and the business skills to manage a spa.

Fitness and Health Promotion

Become a fitness and health consultant with knowledge of exercise science, coaching, health promotion and business. Includes a field placement. Dual diploma option with Recreation and Leisure Services.

Health Information Management

Analyze data in hospital and healthcare settings to support important decisions on healthcare delivery and financial planning. One of only three CHIMA-recognized programs in Ontario. Includes two placements.

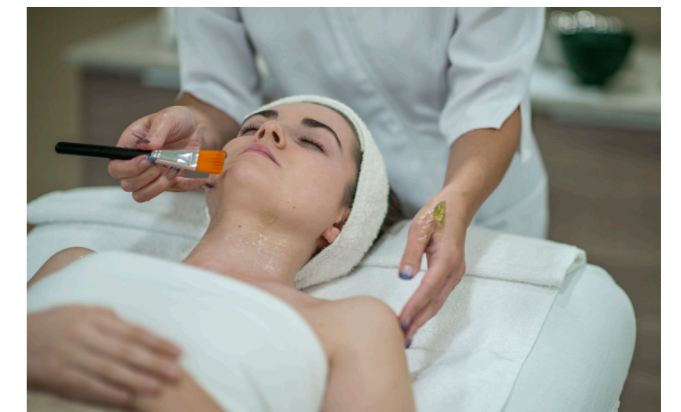

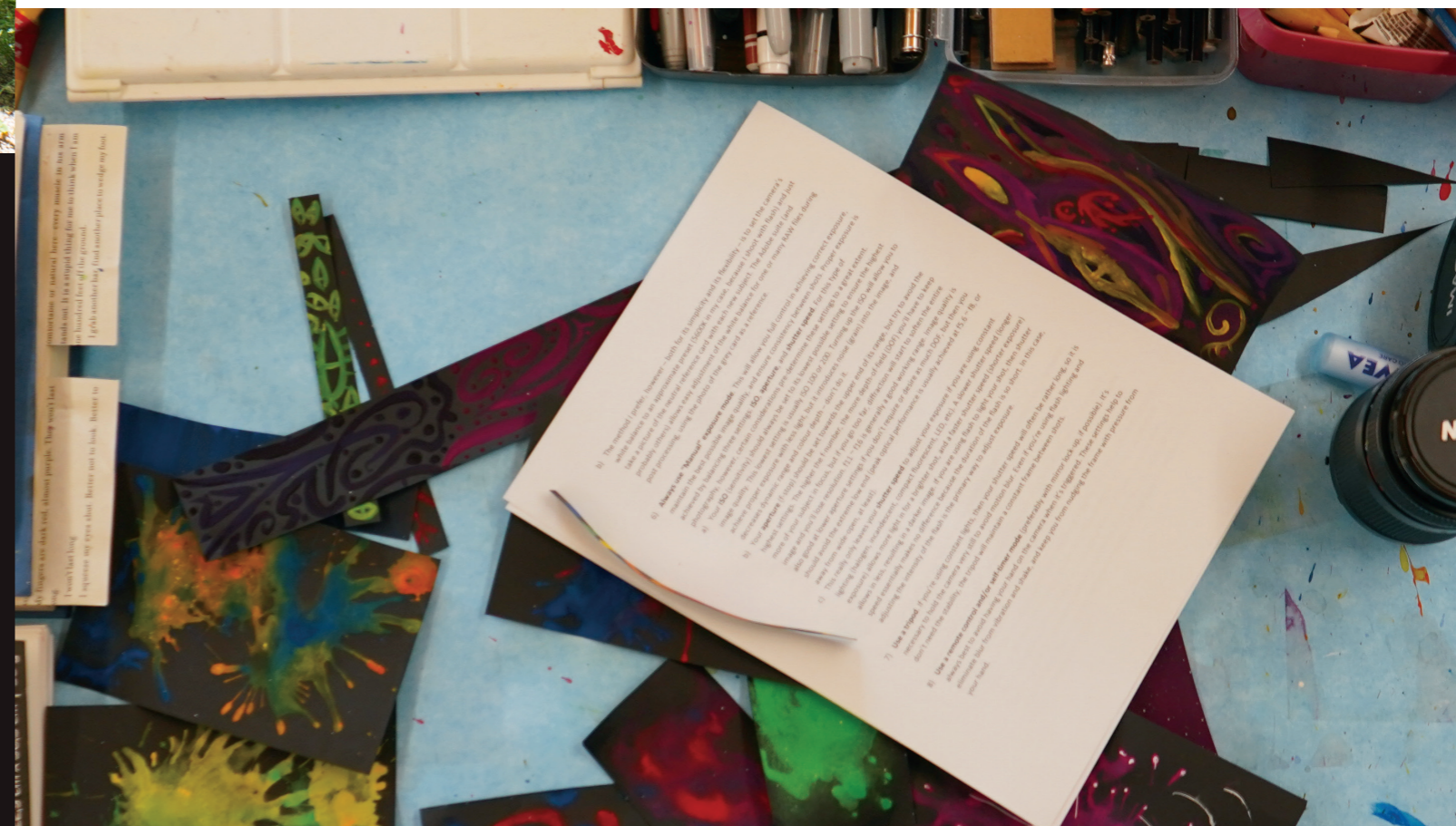

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE BRIDGE (ELB) PROGRAM

We recommend that new students take our ELB placement test on campus. Applicants may also provide a recent IELTS, TOEFL or Duolingo score upon admission and be placed directly into an ELB level.

For maximum learning, students will be placed in the ELB level that corresponds to their lowest individual skill score or, where appropriate, according to the level the program believes is most suitable, regardless of IELTS, TOEFL or Duolingo results.

From Level 8 into a Fleming program

To enter into a Fleming College program, students must meet the program-specific admissions requirements and achieve the following in the English as a Second Language Bridge program:

- For diplomas and certificates: minimum of 70% on course work and on the exit test.
- For graduate programs: minimum of 80% on course work and on the exit test.

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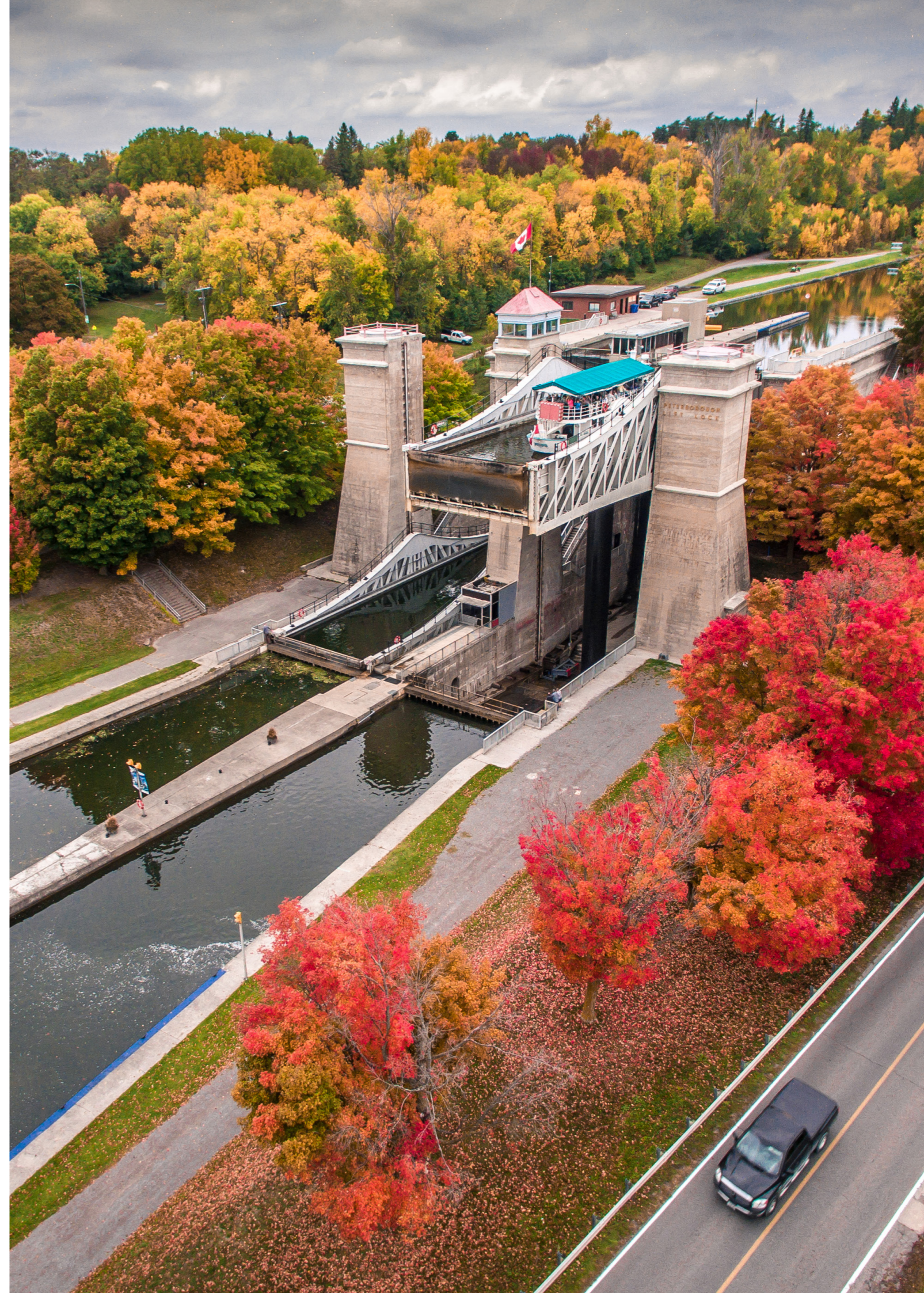
